With improved skills in key areas, participants gain the confidence to take on mentorship roles in their workplace.

This program provides journeypersons an opportunity to learn these skills in a supportive environment. By gaining effective strategies and practical tips, participants are empowered to be mentors.

Subject matter experts deliver training on topics that support effective mentorship in five modules:

MODULE 1: Introduction to First Nations, Métis and Inuit Peoples in Canada


MODULE 2: Cultural Competency
