# PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Participants in the National Program for Journeypersons Supporting Indigenous Apprentices learn effective strategies and gain practical tips to empower them as mentors in their workplaces and the broader skilled trades community. With improved skills in key areas, participants gain the confidence to take on mentorship roles in their workplace.

This program provides journeypersons an opportunity to learn these skills in a supportive environment. By gaining effective strategies and practical tips, participants are empowered to be mentors.

Subject matter experts deliver training on topics that support effective mentorship in five modules:

**MODULE 1:** Introduction to First Nations, Métis and Inuit Peoples in Canada

**MODULE 2:** Cultural Competency

**MODULE 3:** Knowing Your Apprentices

**MODULE 4:** Communication

**MODULE 5:** Being an Effective Mentor

The full program will take approximately 5 months to complete.

CAF-FCA recognizes the distinct barriers faced by women and gender-diverse people from multiply marginalized backgrounds in accessing this type of training. Those from diverse backgrounds (e.g., who are newcomers, identify as 2SLGBTQ+, have a disability, or who are Black, Indigenous, or a person of colour) are especially encouraged to apply.
